Content

The workshop is based on the current (2010) UK Guidelines for Adult, Child and Infant cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and includes:

- Conducting a Primary Survey
- Carrying out CPR on an Adult, Child and Infant in accordance with UK resuscitation guidelines
- Pocket Mask ventilation
- Introduction to AED – setting-up – maintenance checks
- Indications and Contra-Indications for use of AED
- Patient Preparation
- Application and use of AED in simulated cardiac arrest scenarios
- Appropriate patient aftercare
- Anaphylaxis recognition and management
